Daily Routine

7:30 am- Early Opening in Toddler room or outside

8:00 am- Free Play

9:00 am- Clean up, diaper checks, hand washing

9:15 am- Snack

9:45 am- Story time

10:00 am- Outdoor play/walk/toys/crafts

11:00 am- Clean up, diaper checks, handwashing

11:15 am- Lunch

12:00 pm- Nap time

2:00 pm- Wake from nap, diaper checks, free play

2:45 pm- Clean up, hand washing

3:00 pm- Snack

3:30 pm- Storytime

3:45 pm- Diaper checks, outdoor or indoor play

5:00 pm- Gather in 2's room for closing (if indoors) or small playground (if outdoors)

5:30pm- Preschool closes (late fines will be charged after 5:30 pm payable to staff on duty)

- There are scheduled diaper checks however diapers will be changed on an as needed basis



Items your Child will need:

1. Diapers/wipes
2. Diaper cream/cornstarch
3. At least 3 changes of clothing (we do get dirty being busy exploring our world)
4. 2 sets of bedding (2 fitted crib sheets & 2 small top blankets)
5. Any stuffies or pacifiers that your child may need to fall asleep with.
6. Bottle or sippy cup
7. Sunscreen (lotion)/bug spray/sun hat
8. Indoor footwear (no crocks or open toe shoes please)

Important Reminders

1. Label all your child's belongings
2. If on formula bring in pre-mixed bottles
3. We are a peanut free center
4. We do celebrate birthdays feel free to bring in cake/cupcakes/ice cream. All items must be store bought.
5. Watch for activities/events/fundraisers posted on the white board outside the classroom
6. Permission slips may need to be signed from time to time for excursions and walks/ bus trips special events.
7. Bedding is taken home every Friday to be washed and bring back on Monday.

Health and Safety

Please make sure to make contact with your child's teacher on duty when dropping off and or picking up your child. This is most important especially for drop off or pick up from outside yard.

Fevers- we will contact you if your child has a fever of 38.6c Or 101.5f. We will ask if you would like us to give fever reducer (Tylenol), and you will need to pick up your child within the hour of our phone call.

Teething/pain- For teething or pain Tylenol will only be given following this procedure:

1. Bring child to daycare, the teacher will need to check temperature of child, if no fever is present, the child can be given Tylenol for teething/pain.
2. If child has fever upon temperature check child will need to be taken home.
3. Children are NOT to be brought with Tylenol (fever reducers) already in their system, as this may mask another underlying health issue.



Storm Line

We would like to remind parents to check the Preschool Centre's storm line when they are calling for bad or challenging weather. The number is 458-5586. This line will be updated by 6:30 am when poor weather is expected. Please listen for the date and time. If the message has not been updated, then the centers are all open as usual. In case of a storm during the day there may be a possibility of an early closure, if it is decided that we should close early due to weather and/ or poor roads, you will be contacted by phone or text with 2 hours' notice.
